

MH 370: IFALPA urges a continuation of the search

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

MONTREAL, Canada – One year ago today, Malaysia Airlines flight MH 370 disappeared. The aircraft, a Boeing 777-200ER, was carrying 12 Malaysian crew members and 227 passengers from 15 nations.

While all search and rescue efforts so far could not solve this unprecedented mystery, IFALPA urges a continuation of the search until the aircraft has been located in order to complete a full accident investigation according to ICAO Annex 13.

“The families of the victims deserve clear answers, and the aviation world needs the results of a completed accident investigation in order to prevent such disasters from ever happening again,” says Captain Don Wykoff, President of the International Federation of Air Line Pilots’ Associations (IFALPA).

IFALPA remains committed to offering our expertise in the accident investigation.
